The AX-55 is a sophisticated stereo integrated amplifier. To ensure proper operation for the best possible performance, please read this manual carefully.

Choose the installation location of your AX-55 carefully. Avoid placing it in direct sunlight or close to a source of heat. Also avoid locations subject to vibration and excessive dust, heat, cold or moisture. Keep it away from such sources of hum as transformers or motors.

Do not open the cabinet as this might result in damage to the set or electrical shock. If a foreign object should get into the set, contact your dealer.

Do not place records or other objects on top of the amplifier so that the ventilation holes are blocked. This will cause the internal temperature to rise and may result in a failure.

When removing the power plug from the wall outlet, always pull directly on the plug; never yank the cord.

To prevent lightning damage, pull out the power cord.

Do not use force when using the switches and knobs,

When moving the set be sure to first pull out the power plug and remove.cords connecting to other equipment,

Always set the volume control to "0" while lowering the tonearm to play a record, then turn the volume up after the stylus is seated in the record groove.

Do not attempt to clean the AX-55 with chemical solvents as this might damage the finish. Use a clean, dry cloth.



CONNECTION DIAGRAM






CONNECTIONS

CONNECTING THE SPEAKER SYSTEM

Connect the cords going to the left speakers to the L terminals and the right speaker cords to the R terminals, making sure that the "+" and "—" markings are observed. If the "+" and "—" wires are reversed at either speaker, the sound will be unnatural and will lack bass. Speaker cords should be cut as short as possible; do not coil up excess wire on the floor. Also, do not bundle with cords from other system components.

Push in on the lever at the terminal, insert the exposed wire of the speaker cord into the hole and then release the lever. The cord will be locked into position. If these connections are faulty, no sound will be heard from the speakers. (Note) Use a speaker with an impedance of 8 - 16 Ω .




■ SAFETY FUNCTION

Should an abnormality arise when the power is switched on, such as a short in the speaker cord, the amp volume will automatically be cut to "0" and the input selector will not operate. When the abnormal condition is corrected the unit will operate normally when the power is switched on again.

■ CONNECTING A TAPE DECK

Check left and right cords, then connect the terminals.



■ REAR PANEL POWER OUTLET


- Equipment consuming less than 100 watts of power can be connected to the switched outlet. By turning the power switch on the power can be switched on or off with the power switch of the main unit.
- Equipment consuming less than 200 watts of power can be connected to the unswitched outlet. This is not connected to the power switch of the main unit.

■ CONNECTING THE CONTROL SIGNAL

There is an auto function signal output for the turntable, the tuner, and the tape deck. Connect the input and output for each control signal and when the operations shown below are made the amp function will automatically switch over without any need for manual switching.




- * If the amp function is switched over while a record is being played, the tone arm will lift and will return to the arm rest. Also, if the function is switched while a tape is being played the tape deck will automatically stop.
- * If the tuner is already tuned to the station you want to listen to, press the band selector once again and the amp function will switch to TUNER.
- Refer to the connection diagram when connecting the turntable and the tuner, paying attention to left and right connections. Also, read the instructions carefully when connecting a graphic equalizer, video, DAD player, etc.



FRONT AND REAR PANELS PARTS AND FUNCTIONS

FRONT PANEL







10 POWER SWITCH

When the switch is pressed, the power will turn on and the lamp will light. When pressed again the power will turn off. When the power is switched on the function will be preset to TUNER.

2 TONE CONTROLS

BASS At "0" the characteristics will be flat. When turned to the right the bass will be


emphasized and when turned to the left the bass is deemphasized.

TREBLE At "0" the characteristics will be flat. When turned to the right the treble will be emphasized and when turned to the left

the treble will be deemphasized.

6 BALANCE CONTROL


This control lets you adjust the relative volume of the left and right speakers, enabling you to compensate for unbalance caused by installation locations of the speakers and furniture arrangement.



MANUAL INPUT SELECTOR


This unit has an auto function, so normally there is no need to operate this selector. However, the input source can be selected manually.

With each press of the button, you can switch to TAPE → TUNER → PHONO → TAPE and to INPUT REC OUT indicator 8. Tune in to the program you wish to listen to.



6 HINGED PANEL

When the hinged panel is closed the knobs not normally used will be out of sight, presenting a clean panel face. To open the panel press lightly on the \triangle mark at the top of the panel.



10 INPUT/REC OUT INDICATOR

The upper indicator shows the input source while the lower shows the recording source.

This indicates the source selected with the manual input selector or through the operation of the tuner and the turn-

(When power is turned on, the tuner will be selected.)

* Concerning recording, refer to the owner's manual of vour deck.


O VOLUME INDICATORS

Indicates the volume level as set by the volume control (1)



(A) HEADPHONE JACK


Insert the headphone plug. When inserted there will be no sound from the speakers.





AUXILIARY INPUT SELECTOR


A video deck or DAD player can be connected to the rear panel. This selector is used when listening to or recording the input sources. (The INPUT/REC OUT indicator corresponding to the selector will light up.)



(D) VOLUME CONTROL

Adjusts the volume. When the knob is slid to the right the volume will become louder and will be indicated by the volume indicators \bigcirc .

* The volume should always be set at low when turning the power switch on or off, or when changing the function. Also, when lowering the stylus onto the record or when raising the stylus the volume should be kept at low.




LISTENING

Check the connections once again before switching the power on.

- Are the plus and minus sides of the connection cord for the speaker system correct?
- Are all connection cords firmly connected? Also, before switching on, place the amp volume at the minimum position.


■ RECEIVING AM AND FM BROADCASTS

- Follow the directions for "Tuning Procedures" in the tuner owner's manual.
- 2. Adjust the sound volume and tone with the amp.



■ RECORD PLAYING


- Before playing a record (when the stylus is lowering onto the record) and at the end of the record (when the stylus is rising) the volume should be set at the minimum volume.
- 2. Follow the turntable owner's manual to play records.
- 3. Adjust the volume and tone with the amp.



* To switch from record play to tape play, by operating the deck > (play) switch record play will be automatically interrupted and the amp function will change to "TAPE", thus permitting tape playback with a single touch. (Refer to auto function on Page 4.)

■ TAPE DECK PLAYBACK

- Following the instructions in the cassette deck owner's manual, place the tape in the playback condition.
- 2. Adjust the volume and tone with the amp.
 - For recording, refer to the cassette deck owner's manual.



TROUBLESHOOTING

Check the following items should an abnormality occur during use. Should the condition continue, pull the power plug out of the outlet and take the unit to the store where you made the purchase.

The sound image is not stable and is unnatural with no bass sound.	The phase (+, —) of the amp and the speaker does not match.	Match the phase (+, —) to the amp and reconnect.

	The control signal output jack is loose.	Connect the control signal output jack correctly.
